Pet owners must be in line before 8:30pm in order to participate • Cat owners & people with physical challenges will be seen first • Pet owners must be at least 18 years of age to participate • All pets must be on leashes or in carriers • Only healthy & non-pregnant animals will be vaccinated • It is helpful to bring records such as a license renewal notice, prior Rabies Certificate, vaccine record, Spay/Neuter Certificate and/or collar license ID tag • Licensing is available at clinics - Proof of ID is required • Checks/Credit Cards accepted for Licensing • CASH ONLY for vaccines & microchips!

NOTIFY THE VETERINARIAN PRIOR TO VACCINATING IF YOUR PET HAS EVER HAD A REACTION TO A VACCINE, OR IF YOUR PET HAS RECENTLY SHOWN ANY SIGN OF ILLNESS OR COULD BE PREGNANT.

DOG VACCINES

RABIES \$7 (Age: 4 months & older)

All dogs 4 mos old & older must be vaccinated for Rabies and licensed. Vaccines are good for **3 years** if dog is over 1 yr old and has proof of prior licensing or a valid Certificate of Rabies Vaccination from a licensed veterinarian in the U.S. Otherwise, vaccine is good for **1 year**, regardless of dog's age.

DHPP \$17 (Age: 6 weeks & older)

"4-in-1". "Distemper", "Hepatitis", "Parainfluenza" & "Parvo Virus". (Very contagious & potentially fatal diseases). Age 6 to 16 weeks: Initial series of 3 vaccines administered 4 weeks apart. Thereafter, the first booster is recommended in one year, then boosters are recommended every 12 to 36 months.

BORDETELLA \$14 (Age: 8 weeks & older)

"Bronchiseptica Bacterin". (Upper respiratory bacterial infection). Age 8 to 16 weeks: Initial series of 3 vaccines administered 2 to 4 weeks apart. Thereafter, 6 month or annual boosters are recommended, depending on exposure.

LYME \$22 (Age: 9 weeks and older)

"Borrelia Burgdorferi". A tick-borne disease. Only recommended for dogs in areas where tick infestation is a problem. All ages: Initial series of 2 vaccines administered 2 to 4 weeks apart. Thereafter, annual boosters are recommended.

CAT VACCINES

RABIES \$7 (or "PUREVAX" \$20) (Age: 4 mos & older)

Even indoor cats are at risk of contracting this fatal disease. Vaccine is good for **3 years** if cat is over 1yr old and has proof of prior licensing or a valid Certificate of Rabies Vaccine by a licensed U.S. veterinarian. Otherwise, vaccine is good for **1 year**, regardless of cat's age. "**Purevax**" vaccine can help reduce the risk of cats developing sarcomas (cancer) sometimes associated with Rabies vaccinations. It is always a one-year vaccine. Cat licensing is not required.

FVRCP \$17 (Age: 8 weeks & older)

"3-in-1". "Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis", "Calici", and "Panleukopenia" are serious upper respiratory infections. Age 8 to 16 weeks: Initial series of 3 vaccines administered 4 weeks apart. Thereafter, annual boosters are recommended.

FELV \$19 (Age: 9 weeks & older)

"Feline Leukemia" is a highly contagious and potentially fatal disease. 9 weeks and older: Initial series of 2 vaccines administered 4 weeks apart. Thereafter, annual boosters are recommended.
