Subject: Webinar Thurs Nov 14: General Provider Training for the Low Income Health Program (LIHP) Transition

Dear Colleagues,

As you know, the Low Income Health Program (LIHP) Transition marks an important step toward moving LIHP enrollees into Medi-Cal on January 1, 2014.

As part of a comprehensive outreach and education effort, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is pleased to offer a series of educational webinars for **physicians and other providers** on this topic.

During the transition, the majority of LIHP enrollees will shift from county-operated programs to a Medi-Cal Managed Care plan. The first webinar, "*General Provider Training for the LIHP Transition*," will focus on provider-specific guidance regarding changes to existing processes. Topics will include: 1) The process for transitioning enrollees into a Medi-Cal Managed Care plan; 2) How to become a network provider; 3) Overlap in benefits/formulary; 4) Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders; 5) Complex Conditions; 6) 12-month treatment continuation; and 7) Prisoner transitions.

We will also have time designated for Q&A. Please again note, the content of the webinar will be relevant specifically for health care providers. We ask that only provider associations, physicians and their staff, and other providers including pharmacists participate.

Main topics will include: 1) Who will be moving into Medi-Cal in the COHS counties; 2) How to become a network provider; 3) Overlap in benefits/formulary; 4) Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders; 5) Complex Conditions; 6) 12-month treatment continuation; and 7) prisoner transitions.
